2023 Off to a Good Start

I travelled to Armenia in early March with many items on my agenda. Mariam, Marine and I drove to the Ararat Valley Education Center in Lukashin to visit our students. I was impressed with the number of bees working the apricot trees coming into full bloom. I believe that there were three bees for every blossom. We met with Albert who had just installed our small green house, which is where we grew seedlings for transplanting in May. I was impressed with the strength and design of the greenhouse. Drip irrigation was already installed. So, when we talked about STEM-Agriculture, the greenhouse used all the components of STEM. Also, we visited the garden which was plowed and soon to have water to come from the artesian well. We also discussed the fence and gate that will be installed.

We had a very progressive meeting with Irina, Director of COAF that discussed the development and collaboration of the second SMART (STEM) education center which is in the Ararat Valley. We want to meet the needs of Agriculture Education in the next 50 years. We need to light the flame of future leaders. Our work impacts the whole world every day. The global population will increase 1 billion more people in the next 10 years. Thus, we need to develop technology, data collection (from digital tools and sensors) to create reliable artificial intelligence.

On April 24th, I attended a 108th Commemoration of the Armenian Genocide at St James Episcopal Church in Clintonville. Adam Bdoyan gave a short inspirational presentation. This event was well attended by youth and adults. Many uplifting speeches, expressing the resilience of the Armenian people and the development of strong communities, were given. I am pleased that our efforts will help bring fulfillment to this endeavor (Healthy Children/Youth = A Strong Armenia).

In conclusion, I had a meeting with my friend from Syria who is a Syrian-Armenian. He is a waiter 3 doors from the Holiday Inn Express. He has been in Yerevan for 6 years now since he escaped from Aleppo. His parents were in the recent earthquakes in Syria. They were not injured and are maintaining their store for their community. He would like them to come to Armenia, but they wish to stay with their community. He would like them to come to Armenia and then apply to come to America.

English Book Club

The lessons for the English Book Club continue as usual during the mentioned period. Agriculture Club

Albert Karapetyan, a specialist in the field of agriculture with a high education in engineering, was designated by the Uplift Armenia team to conduct agriculture lessons for the students. The curriculum for planting and growing suitable vegetable types for the season is currently being developed. Preparatory work for having a plot of land for planting the seedlings from the greenhouse and increasing the volume of vegetables grown is currently underway. Currently the agriculture club has 8 students.


Renovation of Library Toilet
