2022—The Year 2022 in Review

Joe and I travelled to Armenia in May. We visited with Mariam, Marianne and students and listened to presentations in English in the library. The library now has 1,100 books which are categorized by bar code We also met with the Children of Armenia Fund (COAF) Executive Director, Ara Basam, and President, Irina Igitkhanyan, to discuss how we can complement our sustainable program objectives. During the summer, I received an invitation to speak at the COAF sponsored Annual Conference.


In early October I traveled to Armenia and spoke at the Conference on the Advancement of Rural Communities at their SMART school in Lori Marz. The theme of the Conference was -Business Endeavors as a Driving Force for Local Development. The Conference brought stakeholders together to share the best practices for sustainable community advancement. Dr. Vardan Torchyan, whom I have worked with on several USAID projects, introduced me.



On both trips I met many young Russians, either single or married, who have left their country due to the Russian invasion into Ukraine. They brought their money, deposited into Armenian banks, and looked for work or started new businesses. Many had no plans to return to their homeland.

The Armenian Children's Support Fund has been blessed by two fundraising events. One was sponsored by Adam Bdoyan, the other by Pat White. We appreciate those who attended. We have had a progressive year which will propel us into 2023.

Activities in Lukashin

• On October 1st after the summer break, the English language and literature club resumed its work with 14 new students from Lukashin. The club trainer/leader is Ms Milena Hovsepyan. She is 19 years old and studies at Yerevan Brusov State University of Languages and Social Sciences, with a major in English language and literature. The book which the students are now reading is Antoine de Saint-Exupéry's "Little Prince".



- The Uplift Armenia team continued the process of the Library's digitalisation. It was decided to recruit two Volunteers from Lukashin who will help in the process and in general take care of the registration and take out the books and in parallel they will learn the nuances of the librarian job. Both Ms Svetlana Davtyan and Ms Armik Hovsepyan are 15 years old graduates of the English club and are very enthusiastic two young ladies, who are eager to contribute to the works of Uplift Armenia and have their humble contribution to Lukshins Community life.
- The team continued to equip the library/ classroom firstly by buying new blinds for the windows, which will enable the usage of the projector even in daytime. Secondly, it was very exciting for the kids to receive new books and especially Armenian-English dictionaries, which will help them with their studies and research. It was requested many times by students and English teachers.
- Together with the council member of the Lukashin community Mr Gevorg Zeynalyan the agreement was reached to remove the bushes and plow the garden site in November and do the leveling works of the site in early spring. For the irrigation of the garden a well should be drilled. According to Mr. Gevorg Zeynalyan per meter it costs 50000 AMD and for reaching the level of artesian water there is need to drill at least 40 meter.
- Mr Gevorg Zeynalyan also assists in the renovation works of the Library's restroom. The current restroom needs basic cosmetic renovation and change of old and not functioning pipeline. The works are estimated to be finished at the end of December.
- Together with Richard Funt a visit was made to Lukashin Community school. During the meeting with Mrs Anna Khachatryan, the school principal, she highly appreciated the work of ACSF and its efforts towards engaging children in the development of better communities. Dr Funt stressed the importance of inclusiveness and our wish to work more with marginal children. She noted that this is also quite a big issue for the school itself since many children, especially the young boys, skip classes during harvesting period in order to help their parents in their gardens.
- Despite the fact that Halloween is not celebrated in Armenia, it was requested by some students to have a small-scale celebration of Halloween



on October 30 in order to get a better sense of English culture. The children brought pumpkins and carved them and decorated the room with spooky decorations, which we got from the shipped container earlier. In general we had a good event with funny costumes,



sweets, spookz stories and at the end we watched a movie in English language about the origin of Halloween.

October Trip Report

I traveled to Armenia via Air France and landed at 8:10 PM in Yerevan and was offered a ride to the Holiday Inn Express by Victor Zarougian, his wife Judy Saryan and their daughter and son- in -law. Prior to landing we had a long conversation on the plane from Paris (Charles de Gaulle) about Victor's recent work with ICARE (International Center for Agribusiness, Research and Education ,Yerevan) and the COAF's SMART school in Lori. Judy was going to dedicate a statue of Zabel Yessayan, a women's rights' activist and author of the book, *In the Ruins*, written in the late 1930's. (Note: In 2003, I was invited by ICARE's director, Dan Dunn, to give two lectures to their students. It was on a Friday at 3 PM and the students had come from an hour and half exam. I was impressed by how they were so eager to learn and ask questions during and after my presentation.)

The Holiday Inn Express in Armenia as in the U.S. had a wonderful complimentary breakfast. The Armenian menu offered eggs sausage, yogurt, make your own salad with fresh tomatoes, cucumber, beets, carrots, etc., cheese, fruit juice, Armenian honey, and pastries. Almost every day in the elevator and at breakfast, I spoke to young Russian men and women who arrived by air from Moscow or St. Petersburg.

Mariam and Marine came to the hotel to outline our schedule for the week. On Saturday October 8th, Marine picked me up and drove to Lori marz for the COAF's Conference at their SMART school. We were greeted by Irina, President of COAF and by Dr. Vardan Torchyan who was the moderator of our session. I have known Vardan, who is now working with the Austrian Develop Agency (EU Green Agriculture Initiative in Armenia) in Debet Village, Lori region for several years. My presentation centered on Agriculture, Water, and Agriculture Education. The theme of my presentation was healthy soils, healthy plants and



healthy people. Over 200 guests were welcomed to the conference by COAF founder Garo Armen via video message. The day was topped off with a performance by the Tavush Diocese Children's Choir, led by Maria Galstyan, recipient of the Armenian's publics heart at the Starmus VI Festival in September. The choir presented a medley of uplifting songs, calling for unity, perseverance and faith for the nation. I heard them sing *We Are the Champions*.
