## Looking Forward to 2023

Mariam, Marine and I are looking forward to the Dedication of our Library to be known as the Ararat Valley Educational Center. Over the past year we have installed

a heater/air conditioner, and curtains that reduce the cold and heat coming into the room. We have had a local citizen come clean the room every week. I was very proud of our shelves, desks, and table that creates a space for learning.

I am looking forward to having our students plant seeds and grow transplants and plant them in late spring for summer and fall harvest. Some of these, such as celery and asparagus, need extra care and nurturing in order to harvest a quality product. Both are listed in our dietary needs as providing important nutrients and vitamins not found in other vegetables. It is important that we prepare our garden soil and apply compost for maximum benefit, healthy soils, healthy plants, heathy people.

The asparagus seed comes from Scott Walker of Walker Brothers Inc. in Pittsgrove, New Jersey and was shipped in our container two years ago. I met Scott many years ago, at the time when many new types of asparagus was being tested and planted. His work and passion have brought much to American agriculture and nutritious food to citizens around the world. We are very grateful to Scott for his generous gift of two types of asparagus for the children of Armenia. This gives our students the opportunity to produce, prepare and preserve asparagus.

## Learning Center Activities for December, January, and February

- On December 1st, the students of the English language and literature club finished reading the assigned book, Antoine de Saint-Exupéry's "The Little Prince," with teacher Ms. Milena Hovsepyan. With her suggestion, a themed day on the novel was organized as a closing event during which the children watched the first-ever animated feature film adaptation of the book and shared their thoughts on the novel and its adaptation.
- The Uplift Armenia team finished the process of the library's digitalization with the help of two volunteers from Lukashin: Ms. Svetlana Davtyan and Ms. Armik Hovsepyan. It was also announced on the Uplift Armenia Facebook page that the library is now open and everyone is welcome to visit and lend books.
- On December 23rd, the Uplift Armenia team organized an American Christmas celebration and Christmas tree decoration with children from Lukashin. It was agreed that the children would also play Secret Santa, and at the end, everyone exchanged their presents.
- On December 24th, an interesting workshop and discussion was held in the library. The engineering team lead of the Armenian Wirestock startup, Mr. Nver Abgaryan, spoke with the Lukashin children about general developments in the information technology sphere, IT professions, and innovations of the future like artificial intelligence. In the practical part of the workshop, the children were divided into two groups, where they started to develop their startup ideas and pitch them to the audience. Due to the children's interest in IT-related occupations, it was agreed to have meetings with other representatives of the IT field in the future.
- After a short winter holiday break, the library and the English book club started operations on January 10th, 2023. The children, with teacher Mrs. Milena, chose "Alice in Wonderland" as the book of the month to read.
- On January 14th, the Uplift Armenia team organized an excursion for the Lukashin children to the Parajanov Museum in Yerevan. The visit was very interesting and inspiring for many students who are interested in painting, performance art, and filmmaking.
- Currently the Uplift Armenia team negotiates on the renting of a 20 Sqm greenhouse for doing flowers/vegetables growing project with children.
